









Bell Pepper Drawings

Architects draw buildings in many different ways. **Elevation**, **plan**, and **section** are three types of **technical drawings** that architects create when designing a building. Follow the instructions below and draw the bell pepper in each type of drawing. When finished, use the back of this sheet to draw your home in each style (and enjoy your pepper as a snack while you do!).

<p>Elevation example</p> 	<p>Elevation description</p> <p>An elevation shows the exterior (outside) of the building. You look at and draw one side at a time.</p>	<p>Bell pepper elevation</p> 	<p>Draw it!</p>
<p>Plan example</p> 	<p>Plan description</p> <p>A floor plan shows the interior (inside) from a bird's-eye view. Each floor of a building has its own floor plan.</p>	<p>Bell pepper plan</p> <p>Cut your pepper around the middle</p> 	<p>Draw it!</p>
<p>Section example</p> 	<p>Section description</p> <p>A section drawing shows the interior (inside) of a building. It looks similar to a dollhouse that has one exterior (outside) wall removed.</p>	<p>Bell pepper section</p> <p>Cut your pepper in half, top to bottom</p> 	<p>Draw it!</p>

Elevation

The outside of the building, from any side.

Plan

The inside of the building, from above.

Section

The inside of the building, as though it has been cut in half.
